1. SOLEDAD ACOSTA DE SAMPER: PIONEERING INTELLECTUAL AND AUTHOR: *Colombian Foundational Voice:*

Soledad Acosta de Samper (1833-1913) was a prolific Colombian writer, journalist, historian, playwright, and feminist. Her extensive output and diverse literary forms established her as a central figure in 19th-century Latin American letters.
